What are british values?

Schools are required to provide for the spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of their children. Part of this means that as a school we promote British Values.

- " Mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs.

Why teach british values?

The purpose of teaching British values is to help children to become well-rounded members of our society. British values are a central part of all teaching and learning, and are promoted throughout the curriculum, and across all age groups in school.

They are part of our school policies, our mission statement, assemblies, special events, fundraising and cultural celebrations.

What do british values look like in school?

Democracy

We encourage the children to have a pupil voice and be involved in discussions, decision-making and voting, both in the classroom and within our School Council.

The Rule of Law

Children are encouraged to understand that rules and laws are needed to help keep us safe and happy.

Children are involved in creating class rules, that their own behaviour and the behaviour of others carries consequences, helping children to understand right from wrong, and making the right choices.

Individual Liberty.

We promote the importance of the freedom to choose faiths, beliefs and likes/dislikes. Children are encouraged to know, understand and exercise their rights and personal freedoms and advised how to exercise these safely, for example through our E-Safety and PSHCE lessons. Successes and achievements are shared to develop self-esteem and confidence, and a positive self-image. We encourage children to try a range of experiences and opportunities, and to select their own preferences.

Mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs.

We demonstrate respect and tolerance towards other faiths and beliefs, by providing activities, visits and experiences which allow children to understand the cultures, traditions and ways of life of others. Our RE and PSHCE teaching reinforces this.
